

A Vision for Greater Mission



A Special Message From Pastor Mike Hoppe

At Stillwater, serving others isn't just something we do - it's who we are. Our Food Pantry, Backpack Ministry, Serve Sundays, mission trips, disaster response, and countless other efforts reflect our deep commitment to being the hands and feet of Jesus. We believe the church doesn't just have a mission - the church IS a mission. Our calling is to expand Jesus' message and work wherever He leads us.

In that spirit, our church has been prayerfully exploring the idea of launching a Resale Store in the Saraland community. This store would serve as a ministry in itself - creating opportunities for volunteers and staff to build relationships, share Christ's love, and serve those who might never step inside a church. Since there are no other Christian resale stores in our area, we believe this is a unique chance to meet a real need - providing a place for community members to donate goods and offering affordable items to those who need them most.

For several months, a dedicated team of Stillwater members has been praying, brainstorming, and planning for this initiative. At our recent church-wide Town Hall, we received valuable feedback, and now we want to share our vision for what this Resale Store could become.

How the Store Would Work

Proceeds with Purpose: All store proceeds would support Stillwater Church's mission. First, funds would cover store-related costs such as salaries and building expenses, ensuring that the store operates independently of the church's main budget. Start-up costs will come from various sources, including our upcoming Yard Sale and private donations. Second, all net profits would directly benefit our community - supporting major initiatives like our Food Pantry, which has significant needs and a growing vision for expansion.

Staff & Volunteers: We envision hiring a paid store director to lead this ministry (a job description is available in the church office). Other paid positions may be considered in the future, but this mission will rely on a strong team of volunteers. Opportunities include sorting, organizing, staging, online sales, cleaning, and serving on the Store Team.

Finding the Right Location: We are actively searching for a high-visibility, accessible location with ample parking. This space could be either rented or purchased.

Store Hours & Growth: We plan to start small and expand as donations, leadership, and volunteer support grow.

A Long-Term Vision: A Community Mission Center

Looking ahead, we dream of creating a Mission Center - a space that could house both our Resale Store and expanded community services. This could include a larger Food Pantry, social services for those in need, and possibly even a shower/laundry facility for the homeless. Our prayer is that the Resale Store will flourish, allowing us to make an even greater impact for Christ in our community.

How You Can Get Involved

We are excited about what God is doing through Stillwater and this potential Resale Store! 

UNLOADING FOOD TRUCK: Days vary. Receive 1-2 food trucks per month. Arrival time is usually in the mornings.

BAGGING FOOD BAGS: Thursday, every other week. Time: 3:00pm-5:30pm

FOOD DISTRIBUTION: Mondays. Time: 8:30am-11:15am PRODUCE DISTRIBUTION: Fridays, on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Friday each month. Time: 10:00am-1:15pm (Light lunch is usually provided on Produce Day)
